Inside Samuel Pepys' Office: naval papers from the Pepys Papers at the Bodleian Library

A Breviate Calendar

This Calendar brings together in one place for the first time the catalogue entries related to Samuel Pepys' various naval papers at the Bodleian Library. It is intended as a guide to scholars wishing to access the papers relating to naval affairs in the late 16th century, and during the 17th century, created by or collected by Pepys during his career or shortly thereafter, and other naval documents of the early 18th century collected by Bishop Rawlinson, Dr Thomas Smith or Thomas Tanner; there are also relevant papers in the Bodleian's Ballard collection. The catalogue covers all such papers, but entries focus on those created during Pepys' career as a senior official of the Navy Board or the Admiralty, including Pepys' business letters to Edward Mountagu, the 1st earl of Sandwich, held amongst the Sandwich Papers collected by John Carte.

The entries are derived from the Rawlinson Collections entries in the Catalogi Codicum Manuscriptorum Bibliothecae Bodleianae... Ricardi Rawlinson..., edited by William Macray MA and published at Oxford in several volumes from 1862. Carte and Tanner holdings were identified in Macray's volumes dealing with those collections. Each page in Macray has also been digitised in individual files, and although they are not searchable this offers a convenient/resource for initial scoping; the files are available on request/The entries were cross-referenced with A Summary Catalogue of Western Manuscripts in the Bodleian Library at Oxford, vol III, edited by Falconer Madan MA, Oxford 1895; the Summary Catalogue may also be accessed digitally, on request.

The entries in the following calendar show the numbers of relevant volumes, with a brief description of contents, and includes the folio numbers and descriptions of the papers reproduced in the current selection. The volume descriptions include Samuel Pepys' original titles, notes by Richard Rawlinson, the original descriptive entries by Macray, and additional descriptors by the author.

Pepys' Papers (R A170 to A234 inclusive, and A486) - volume descriptions in **bold**: SP plus a Roman lowercase number: number of Pepys' original file, with Pepys' title or description of contents, where available, in quotation marks. Rawlinson's notes are enclosed within {curled parentheses}.

Macray's entries are shown in Roman text, unparenthesised.

The author's notes are printed in italics enclosed in [square parentheses].

Volume descriptions – other papers:

Descriptors are by the author, with those by Macray in {curled parentheses}.

Folio descriptions:

Descriptors are from the author's research, or adapted from Macray.

Only those individual papers which are printed or quoted in the current book are listed and the number in the third column is of the document so reproduced.
